

# Villagers Here in Double Header Attraction

## SECOND GAME IN WAYNESBORO SERIES

Stevens Likely Choice to Lead Ramseyites on Mound.

### MONDAY'S WIN EXTRA INNINGS

The Hustlers led by Bill King took the first of a series of two games from Waynesboro yesterday afternoon in the latter's town by the score of 4 to 2, in a game that went for an extra session.

Two Hustlers crossed the plate during the first two stanzas and were held scoreless after that for the remainder of the nine innings; the Villagers evened up things by grabbing one in the fourth and one in the ninth; the extra session opened up by Miller singling. Day popping out a sacrifice, a double by Neptune, and a sacrifice fly by Costello bringing in two runs.

The Champs are hitting their stride and are easily maintaining the top position in the league race and while they are winning consistently, all the other teams are playing a very steady game, making the race one full of pep.

In today's game, Stevens, will in all likelihood get a chance to go on the mound, with Ramsey and Costello as possible runners-up. Horan will in all probability be on the receiving end.

King pitched a great game, allowing but five hits and striking out eight men. The Champs collected 12 hits off Burke, including a double by King, Gardner, Neptune and Horan. Burke, however, tightened with men on bases and as a result 12 Champs perished on the sacks. Waynesboro's hitting was much more opportunistic and but four of the "babes" were stranded. Frederick scored one in the first and repeated this performance in the second. Burke then struck his gait and the Champs were held scoreless until the tenth, when the game was won.

The home team put one across in the fourth. Their efforts to score again were futile until the ninth, when Clark, batting for Morrin, singled. Lordy followed with a safe hit, sending Clark to third and the latter scored a minute later on a sacrifice by Fitzgerald.

Yordy and Kanaus were the chief clubbers for Waynesboro. Both hit safely twice out of four times up. One of Yordy's hits went for three bases, the longest drive of the game. Every Champ got at least one safe hit except Costello. Day, Gardner, Neptune and Horan came in for a pair of safeties, the latter three getting doubles. While Frederick more than doubled the home team in hits Burke got in his work when a hit would have counted for a run. The same teams will meet again today.
