Notes - From The Hagerstown Morning Herald, **“TOBEY HURLS WELL AND TERRIERS WIN...Crippled Terriers Find Batting Eye and Win, 5-4.”**

Hagerstown's Bert Weeden sent out a new pitcher, Tobey, against the Hanover Raiders, and the crippled Terriers came away with a hard fought, 5 to 4 victory at McAllister Field on Wednesday afternoon.

The Raiders tallied the game's first run in the third inning when pitcher Warden singled, took second on Jimmie Cook's sacrifice bunt, and scored on Billy Starr's base hit.

The Terriers tied the score in the fourth with a run of their own, Jack Hurley and "Polly" Speraw each singled.. Walt "Red" Herrell, the former Gettysburg player recently acquired by Hagerstown, stepped up and cracked a timely base hit to bring home Hurley to tie the score at 1-1.

It looked like the momentum would swing in Hanover's favor in the bottom of the fourth, when they scored three runs off Tobey's delivery. Jimmy Caddin reached on a free pass, and took second on Kimble's sacrifice bunt. Ned Crowder doubled to bring home Caddin. George Stroh walked. Warden grounded out to first, but the runners advanced into scoring position. Cook came through with a base hit, and both Crowder and Stroh scored, giving Hanover a 4 to 1 lead.

Before Warden could get comfortable with his lead, the Terriers attacked the Raiders pitcher for four runs in the fifth inning to regain the lead for good. Tobey singled, and took third on Charlie Dysert's base hit. Dysert stole second, and Tobey scored on Bill Phoenix' base hit. After Hurley went out, Speraw connected for another base hit, and Dysert raced home to cut the Raiders lead to one run. Phoenix scored on John Doherty's sacrifice fly, and Speraw came across when Starr misplayed Herrell's grounder for an error.

Notes – Darkness ended an exciting game between front runners, Martinsburg and Chambersburg at Wolf Park, as the game was deadlocked at 1 to 1, after nine innings, with each club scoring a run in the 10th inning, when the game was called.
